Integrated Program
Comp-Int MED, Planning a Practice training integrated in Inst-Beg workshop. Coaches who have not attended Inst-Beg will access via P/T multi-sport system. Evaluation of Planning a Practice through Inst-Imd portfolio.

Training Description:

- 15-hour workshop over two days. Can be delivered in modules over several days.
- Various coach activities throughout Training: String Making, Bow and Arrow Tuning, Arrow Selection and Arrow Construction, Archery Games, Finding Arrow Faults, Ethical scenarios
- Complete weave of multi-sport materials. Uses multi-sport Teaching and Learning and Design a Basic Sport Program as a template and adds sport-specific material where appropriate.
- Coach must sign code of conduct upon completion of workshop

Evaluation Description:

- Coaches analyse the form of an intermediate archer and participate in solving various case studies. Key evidences are verified throughout evaluation.
- Separate on-site evaluation of instructor's Practice and Intervention.
- Coach completes portfolio following Evaluation Day in order to achieve certification. Coaches are given one year to complete portfolio requirements. Portfolio includes: Lesson Plan, EAP, Observation Plan, Programme Outline, Analyse Performance Referent Model, Coach self assessment, Assessment from parent/archer, Assessment from administrator.
- Coach must complete Make Ethical Decisions Online Evaluation for full certification.

Learning Facilitator & Evaluator training:

- Learning Facilitator/Evaluator Training was initially implemented over two days on April 2-3, 2005 and updated during the Canada Winter Games 2007. National representation from Provinces/Regions. Training is upgraded to meet Inst-Imd requirements.
