This is a fully integrated workshop.

Training Description:

Coaches who take this two-day workshop will become a **trained** "Club Coach." This is a program designed to enhance the skill set of the coach and instructor who function primarily at the club level. The Club Coach will be competent in training curlers from youth to masters, with skill levels of beginning to intermediate. The Club Coach will be proficient in planning and designing a practice/clinic, ethical decision-making, teaching correct curling skills, skill analysis, safety, program management, planning, managing and designing a curling program.

Evaluation Description:

There is no evaluation in this context.

Learning Facilitator & Evaluator Training:

Club Coach Learning Facilitators (LFs) participate in a training that covers facilitation skills, practice delivery of specific modules and information on the NCCP. This training takes place in a variety of settings, from a two-day multi-LF workshop, to a one-on-one mentoring training depending on the number of LFs needing training in a particular region.
