Which multi-sport modules will the coaches access through the provincial/territorial delivery system?

Coaches must take Multi-sport Module Part A prior to Judo Specific Training.

### Training Description:

- *Two Day Training program – Coaches must have pre-requisite of Multi-sport module Part A.*
- *Coaches must possess minimum belt level (green) and recommended mat experience prior to training.*
- *Training emphasizes delivery and implementation of Judo practice in a safe and ethical fashion.*

### Evaluation Description:

- *Coaches must submit portfolio prior to Dojo Evaluation. Portfolio consists of Technical workbook completion, Assessment by coach, Assessment by Sensei, Practice Plans, EAP.*
- *Formal observation of coach in his or her coaching environment.*

### Learning Facilitator & Evaluator training:

- *National Training of Master Learning Facilitators (MLFs) and Evaluators at two locations – Calgary and Halifax.*
- *MLFs and Evaluators must implement course prior to training other Learning Facilitators on a provincial basis.*
