Coaches will access all multi-sport modules through the provincial/territorial delivery system.

Training Description:

Coaches will complete a 2-day training course addressing the following topics:

- Team Building
- Drill Design
- Skills Development Pyramid
- Drill Progression
- Individual Skills and Tactics
- Goaltending

Evaluation Description:

Coaches will be expected to show evidence of completion of the following items for evaluation.

- Coach Development Plan
- Mid-season meeting held with players and parents
- Design and evaluation of 3 successive practices designed to teach a team tactic
- Completion of the Make Ethical Decisions on-line evaluation
- Completion of the detect and correct errors on-line assignment and show evidence of the ability to detect and correct errors over the course of practice

Learning Facilitator & Evaluator Training:

NCCP Facilitators are in a position of leadership and generally have significant training and experience as coaches prior to becoming instructors in the NCCP. As the foundation for coaching education in Canada, the NCCP is committed to the delivery of high quality courses that will enable coaches to effectively fulfill their roles. In an effort to ensure that coaches have the benefit of valuable instruction provided by knowledgeable and qualified leaders, the CAC Board

and the Hockey Canada Athlete Development Committee has set **minimum** standards for qualifications of NCCP Course Facilitators.

It is also highly recommended that the facilitator to participant ratio not exceed 15 participants to 1 facilitator. This ratio is intended to enrich the learning experience of the coaches and to provide an environment where the facilitator truly can facilitate the learning experience. Branches may want to consider a Senior/Junior facilitator structure or Mentor/Apprentice facilitator structure to improve the quality and pool of facilitators

Facilitator Training

All potential Branch Facilitators who have attained required qualifications must attend Course Facilitator training at least once every three (3) years with the encouragement of further professional development whenever possible. This training session must be conducted by a qualified Branch NCCP Master Facilitator approved by the Branch. Facilitators may be other qualified individuals from the community working under the direct supervision of a Master Facilitator. New Facilitators must attend, before being recognized as a NCCP Facilitator.

New NCCP Facilitators must attend a two day Branch training seminar prior to being recognized as NCCP Facilitator. Facilitators must participate in individual training programs for Coach Stream and Developmental Stream to be recognized as a Facilitator for each level.
