Training Description:

There are two parts to the training: the CYA Fundamental Coach Course and the Learn to Sail Coach Clinic.

Fundamental Coach Course - This is a 2.5 to 3 day course, which provides the theory base necessary for professional sailing coaches. This course covers the following modules: Introduction to Coaching & Professionalism, Make Ethical Decisions, Provide a Safe Environment, Teaching & Learning, and Planning a Practice. All Learn to Sail (LTS) coaches must complete this training prior to attending a LTS clinic.

Learn to Sail Coach Clinic

This 3 day practical course delivered by the Provincial Sailing Associations includes:

- Coach boat positioning
- Skill/Drill Progressions
- Developing practice plans for on-water lessons
- Managing a LTS Program
- Planning a Course Curriculum
- Detection & Correction
- Conducting structured on-water practice sessions

Successful completion of LTS Coach clinic including assessment in the following safety criteria will enable the coach to receive “trained” status and conduct LTS programs awarding CYA certificates in his/her club.

- Operate a coach boat
- Run a practice session managing risk
- Act in a professional manner

Evaluation Description:

Evaluations are conducted by the Provincial Sailing Associations either through evaluation clinics or visits to the candidates clubs. Each evaluation is expected to take up to ½ day to complete. Candidates are observed teaching a land lesson and conducting an on-water practice session for Bronze Sail participants. Prior to the observation, candidates submit a practice plan for an on-water session as well as an EAP to the Evaluator.

Learning Facilitator & Evaluator Training:

In order to facilitate national implementation in 2008, Master Learning Facilitators/Evaluators were trained at a national workshop after which they in turn trained current Instructor Evaluators in their provinces in the new programs. Beginning in 2009, one or more national LF/Evaluator workshops will be held annually to train candidates from each province in order to maintain a national standard. This workshop is typically conducted over 4 days.

3 most innovative features of your program:

1. There is one clinic for the training of coaches for both the Instruction – Beginners (White Sail) & Instruction – Intermediate Performers (Bronze Sail) contexts, but separate context-specific evaluations are required.
2. Three Competition – Introduction NCCP multi-sport modules are integrated into the CYA Fundamental Course; a requirement for all CYA coaches.
3. A one page final evaluation form was developed along with accompanying rubrics to simplify the evaluation process for the evaluators.
