### Training Description:

- This one-day (7 hrs) workshop takes place in an arena or community centre
- The coaching session, technical planning and analysis allows for a structured assessment by the Learning Facilitator (LF)
- Course fee – \$60 includes course manuals

### Learning Facilitator Training

- Master Learning Facilitators (MLFs) were identified by the Canadian Broomball Federation to attend a funded training session
- MLFs were refreshed on adult education principles and facilitation skills

### 3 most innovative features of the BF<sup>2</sup> program:

1. One-day format allows for a one-stop coaching program that allows new coaches the opportunity to learn the basic principles of broomball
2. Allows parents, grandparents, and older siblings the opportunity to work with new broomball players
3. Gives individuals the opportunity to gain experience in coaching and to understand the importance of teaching the sport properly
