Sustainability

1. OTP 2010 is the needed example to governments, sponsors and others of the success that can be accomplished – incentive
2. RTE emphasizes the need for major revisions and development of sport delivery, including major improvements in Provincial delivery
3. Creating a national HP technical unit (Podium Canada) as a partnership involving all contributors, to win medals, sets the ship sailing
4. Corporate sponsor success with 2010 greatly assists their involvement in 2012 and 2014
5. New program initiatives (OTP – recruitment, Top Secret, PETs, technology) sets new standards and expectations
6. COC, CPC and 2010 Legacy Fund value is in excess of \$250m cash. Calgary provided \$150m (1988 value).
7. VANOC, OTP, RTE, NSO pros and volunteers - future leaders
8. 2010, COP and other facilities

Partnerships

1. Need for clear & commonly accepted goals (medals) to unite all in common approach
2. New unique national model (PC, OTP, RTE) for HP leadership and excellence – NSOs, COC, CPC, VANOC, SC, CSCs
3. Examples: Sport Matters; new CODA facilities and services
4. Government desire for shared funding (corporations, COC etc.)
5. PC Strategic Advisory Committee – national policy and program coordination
6. Re-defining roles/responsibilities of major players
7. Need for Provincial partnerships and engagement
8. New leadership challenges (e.g. SC, COC, NSOs; OTP operations)
