# “PELÉ” LAW

## Concept

Comprises *formal practices*, ruled by national and international norms and by the rules on sports practice of each modality, accepted by the respective national entities of the sports administration and *non-formal practices*, characterized by the ludic freedom of their players.

Sport may be acknowledge in its manifestation of efficiency, as provided for by the sports legislation in effect: “played according to the general norms of this law and national and international rules of sports practice. With the purpose of achieving results and integrating people and communities in the country and of these with other nations”.

(1st paragraph of first article and item III of article 3rd of Law No. 9615/98)

## **DESCRIPTION**

### **– MINISTRY OF SPORTS (ME)**

Responsible for the formulation and execution of the National Sports Plan.

### **– NATIONAL SPORTS COUNCIL (CNE)**

Collegiate body, comprising 22 members, of a consultative and normative character, responsible, among other things, for: defining priorities for the application of the FUNDESP's Funds.

### **– NATIONAL SPORTS SYSTEM**

Integrated by COB, the National Sports Administration entity, and its affiliates, the regional and municipal entities of sports practices.

### **– BRAZILIAN OLYMPIC COMMITTEE (COB) AND BRAZILIAN PARALYMPIC COMMITTEE (CPB)**

Responsible for representing the Country at Olympic, Pan-American and other similar events, at the International Olympic Committee and at the International Olympic Movement and for fostering the Olympic movement in the national territory.

### **– NATIONAL ENTITIES FOR THE SPORTS ADMINISTRATION (CONFEDERATIONS/ LEAGUES)**

They will affiliate, pursuant to its By Laws, both state administration and sports entities.

### **– REGIONAL ENTITIES FOR THE SPORTS ADMINISTRATION (FEDERATIONS / LEAGUES)**

They will affiliate, pursuant to its By Laws, municipal sports entities (Clubs, Association and Similar entities).

### **– ENTITIES FOR SPORTS PRACTICES (CLUBS, ASSOCIATIONS)**

They will affiliate, pursuant to its By Laws, people interested in practicing sports.

## **OPERATION OF THE MINISTRY OF SPORTS**

The Ministry of Sports, through its National Sports Secretariat, works directly with 146 National Entities for the Sports Development, comprising 02 Committees, 132 Confederations and National Federations and 12 Parasports Federations.

We also operate with approximately 2,784 legally established regional Federations, leagues and State Sports Secretariats.

### **ACTIONS BY THE FEDERAL GOVERNMENT**

**RUMO AO PAN** – concentrated on the success of the XV Pan-American Games and the III Parapan American Games to be held in the City of Rio de Janeiro, in 2007, it received resources in the amount of US\$600,000.00;

**BRAZIL IN THE HIGH PERFORMANCE SPORTS** – it aims at promoting qualitative and quantitative changes in the national sports, it received resources in the amount of US\$10,181,000.00,

### **HIGH PERFORMANCE ACTIONS BY THE SPORTS SECRETARIAT**

- **DISCOVERING SPORTS TALENTS**– To identify young people and adolescents, registered in the school network who reveal motor development levels compatible with the competitive and high performance sports .

- **NUCLEOUS OF BASIC SPORTS**– It provides a structure with physical and human resources for the formation of athletes.

- **HIGH PERFORMANCE TRAINING CENTERS**– It provides an adequate structure for the practice of one or more sports modalities.

- **BRAZILIAN STUDENTS GAMES** – The national stage of the students competitions is carried out in two stages. The 1st one from 15 to 17 years of age and the 2nd one from 12 to 14 years of age, all duly enrolled in the junior and high school, public or private, school system

- **ATHLETE'S SCHOLARSHIP** – To assure the minimum personal maintenance to the high performance athletes who are not sponsored.

- **CENESP NETWORK**- Its objective is to detect, select and develop sports talents, particularly in the olympic and paralympic modalities.

## ***AGNELO / PIVA LAW - LAW No 10264, of July 16, 2001***

Action by the Federal Government, since it started investing such funds, in January 2002, COB has encountered a gradual and qualitative technical growth in all olympic modalities. The result of a strict and discerning work done with the Confederations, the results achieved at the most important international competitions has been corroborating how important is for the Brazilian olympic sports to be able to count with permanent and continuous resources for their development.

And thanks to the Agnelo/Piva Law, the so dreamed evolution of the Brazilian sports has already became a reality.

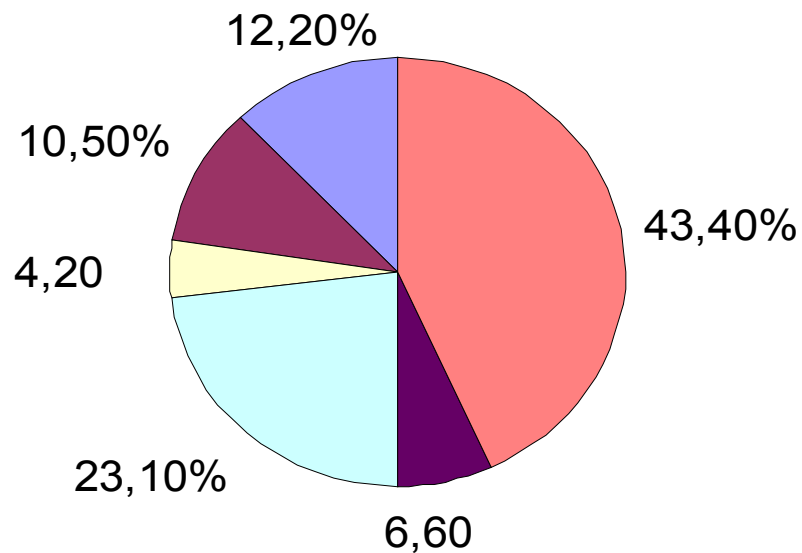
# Direct Consequence of the application of the resources from Agnelo/Piva Law

- . Creation of Training Centers integrated by the National Sports Secretariat, the Municipal and State Sports Secretariats, the Brazilian Olympic Sports Confederations and Federations.
- . All regions have registered a growth in the number of modalities played.
- . athletes of different modalities from those regions are having access to training and are participating in competitions.
- . Agnelo/Piva Law has enabled the hiring of technical commissions by the Confederations which has resulted in the improvement and development of the athletes' performance.
- . Importation of specific material for the several modalities, aiming at the improvement of the preparation for this Olympic Cycle.
- . Increase in the number of permanent Olympic Teams.
- . Improvement in the administrative management of the confederations and the COB.
- . Participation of a larger number of modalities and of athletes in international competitions.

# NORMS FOR THE APPLICATION OF THE RESOURCES

According to Agnelo/Piva Law, the resources shall be exclusively applied in six actions

- 1.1 Fomentation programs and projects
- 1.2 Entity's Maintenance
- 2.3 Human resources capacity building
- 3.4 Technical preparation
- 3.5 Athletes' maintenance
- 4.6 Organization and participation in sport events



## **Action 1.1 – Fomentation Programs and Projects**

- Development of candidacies to host international sport events in Brazil, such as: Olympic Games, Pan-American Games, World Championships, Pre-Olympic competitions, South-American Games, international tournaments and competitions.
- Acquisition of sport and administrative equipment and materials for the COB and for the Brazilian Confederations Administering the Olympic Sports.
- Creation, adaptation, construction, installation, administration and maintenance of units, such as: Olympic Center for the Development of Talents, Olympic Museum, Olympic Academy, High Performance Olympic Center and Training Center.

## **Action 1.2 – Entity's Maintenance**

- Administrative maintenance of the Brazilian Olympic Committee and of the Brazilian Confederations Administering Olympic Sports.

## **Action 2.3 – Human Resources Capacity Building**

- Organization and realization of technical, management, sport medicine and antidoping courses in Brazil.
- Organization and realization of assemblies, congresses, seminars, fairs and symposiums in the area of sports in Brazil.
- Participation in symposiums, seminars on sports, management, sports medicine and antidoping, in Brazil and abroad.
- Capacity building of professionals and manpower specialized in the sports area.

### **Action 3.4 – Technical Preparation**

- Training, in Brazil and abroad, of the teams in the several modalities which will compose the COB's delegations to participate on the Summer Olympic Games, in the Winter Olympic Games, the Pan-American Games and South-American Games.
- Payment of the infrastructure for training and hiring of remunerated technical commissions.

### **Action 3.5 – Athletes' Maintenance**

- Maintenance, food and instruction allowance.
- Payment of expenses incurred during trainings and competitions.
- Allowance of per diem for maintenance and locomotion.
- Athlete's Scholarship.
- All mentioned expenses may occur in Brazil or abroad.

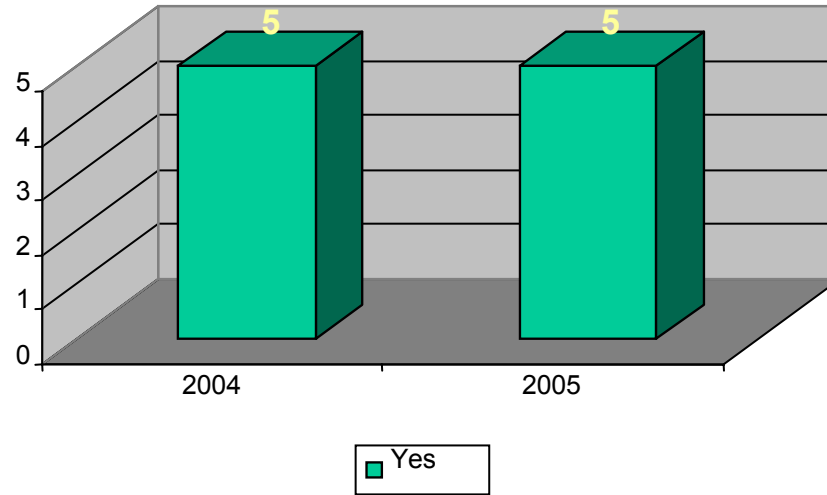
### **Action 4.6 – Organization and Participation in Sport Events**

- Participation in trainings and sport official and amicable, abroad.

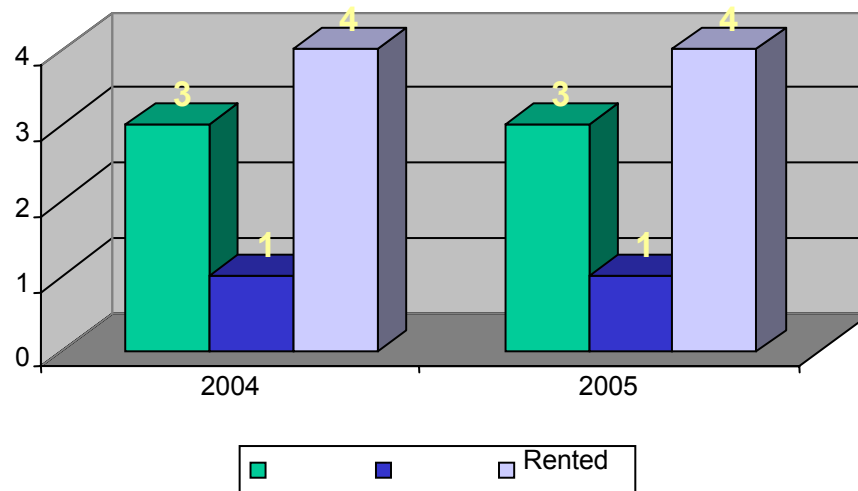

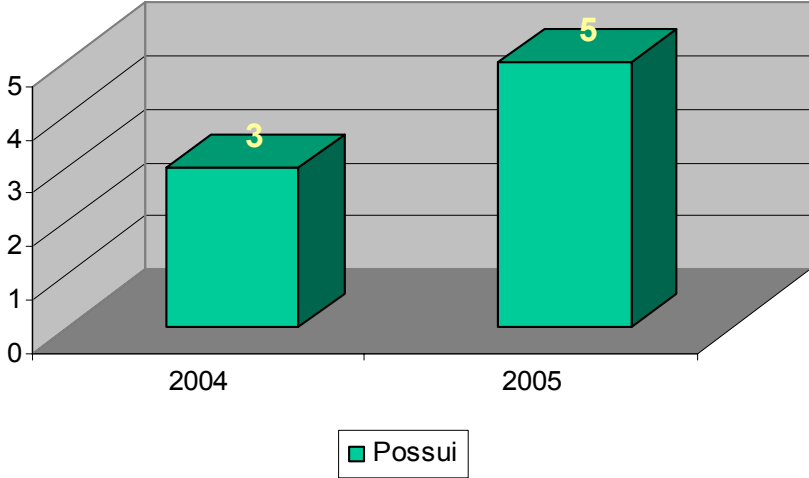
### SPONSORSHIP BY MODALITY



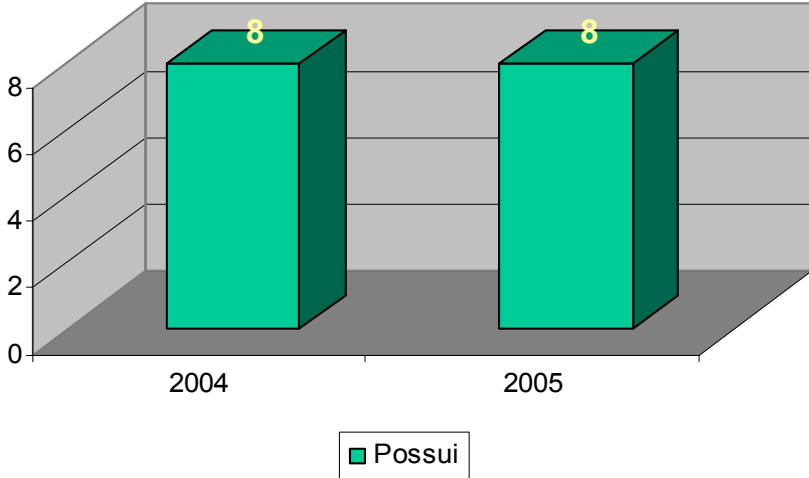
### ENTITIES' HEADQUARTERS



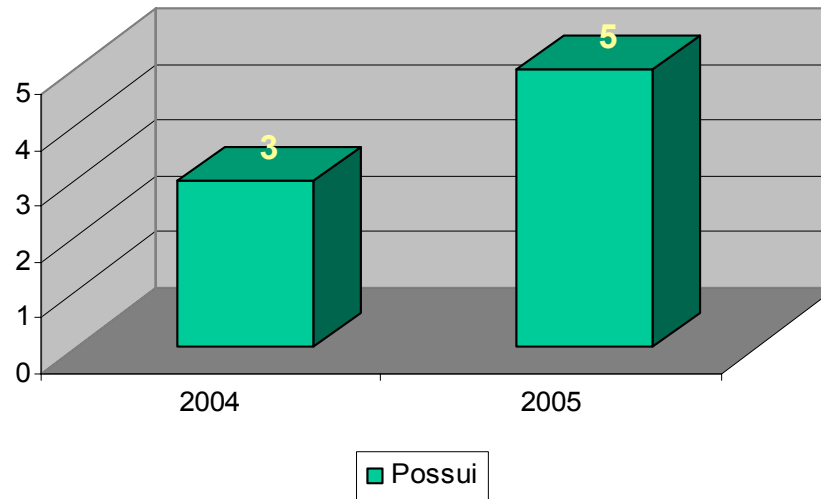
### TRAINING CENTERS - BY MODALITY



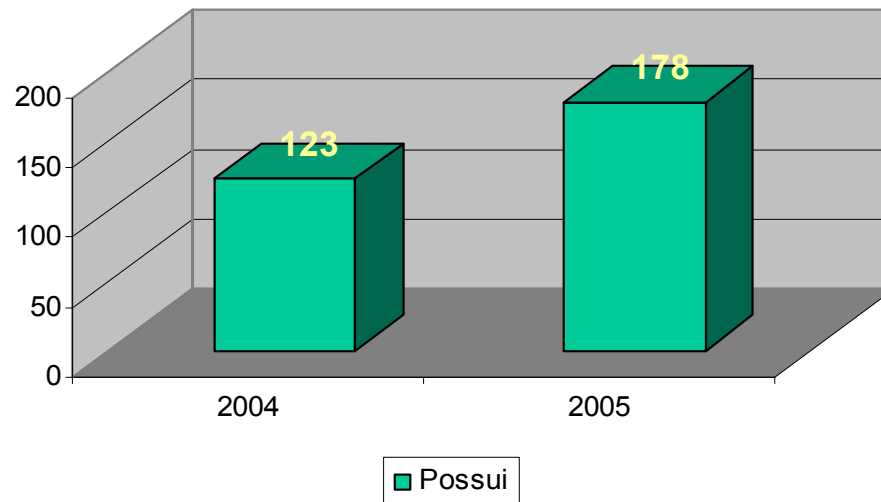
### TECHNICAL COMMISSIONS - BY MODALITY



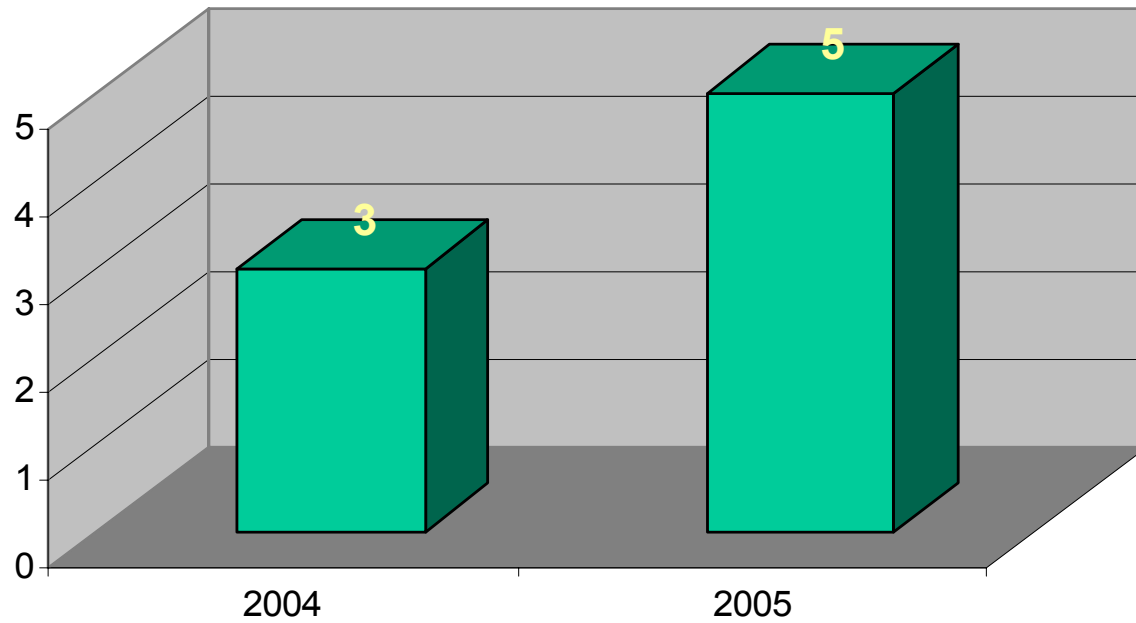
### PERMANENT OLYMPIC TEAMS - BY MODALITY

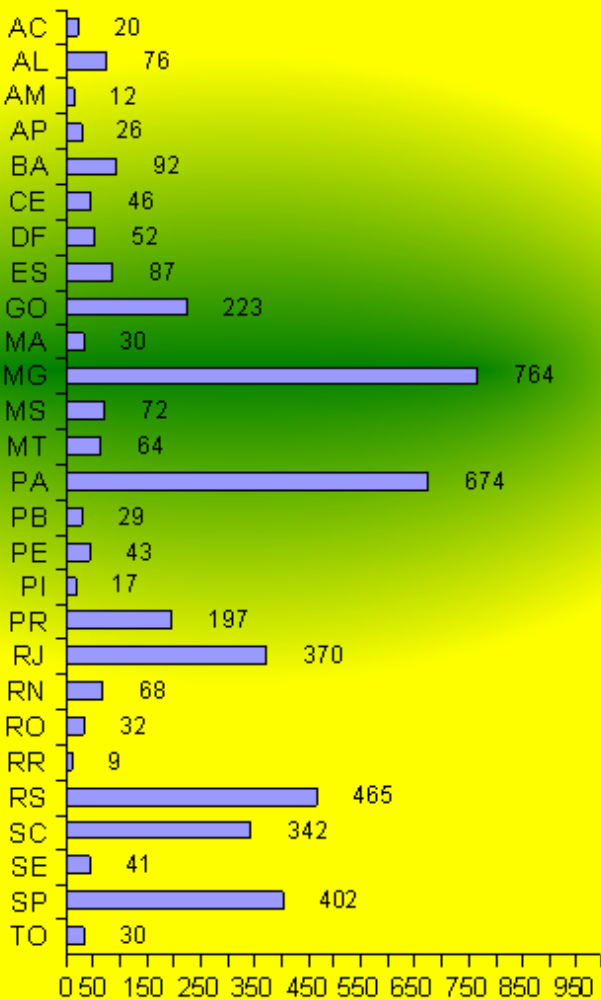

Series B, also by 20 clubs; and

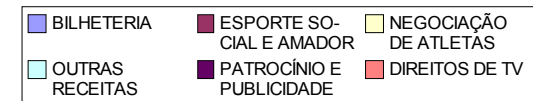
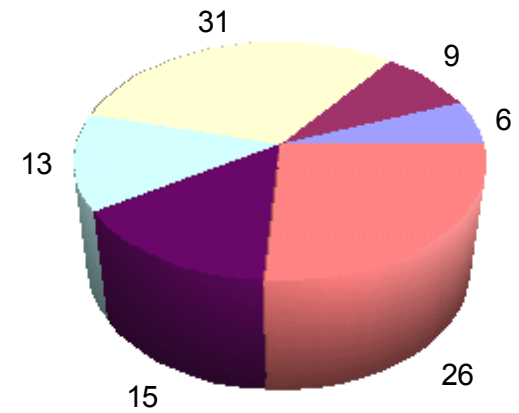
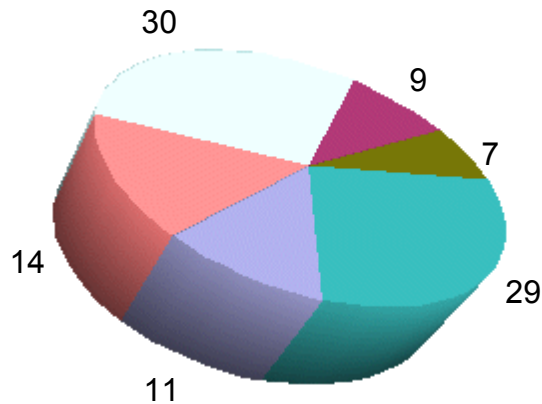
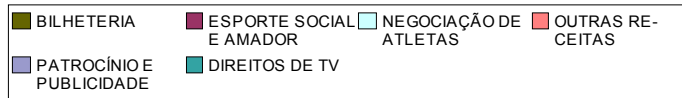
